### **CONIFERS:**

#### Seedlings sizes range from 9"-15" and Transplants range from 8" -24"

Conifer Size Definitions: The first number is the number of years the seedling has been in the bed where the seed was sown. The second number is the number of years the seedling was in a transplant bed. For example, a 2-0 seedling is two years old and a 2-2 seedling is four years old.

- Cedar, White / American Arborvitae Thuja occidentalis (3-1) Height up to 50', flowers open in March and April. Needles are dark green and yellowish beneath. 1/2" long Cones ripen from yellowish to green the following autumn, with 8-10 scales.
- **Fir, Canaan** *Abies balsamea phanerolepis* (*P*+2) Similar to Balsam Fir, approx. 50' tall and 15' wide, will grow in heavier higher pH soils. Prefers well drained soils and are good for windbreaks.
- **Fir, Concolor** *Abies concolor* (3-1) Height 30-50', slow to medium growth rate, prefers acidic, loamy, moist and well drained soils and has moderate drought tolerance, popular Christmas tree choice and makes for a good windbreaks.
- **Fir**, **Douglas** *Pseudotsuga menziesii* (3-0 & 2-2) Height 40-60'. Needles are densely set, with blunt tips and have a strong fruity fragrance. Grows in wide range of soils including acidic, alkaline, loamy, moist, sandy, well drained, and clay soils. Popular Christmas tree choice.
- **Fir, Fraser** *Abies fraseri* (3-2/P+2) A narrow, pyramidal tree with glossy dark needles. Prefers moist well-drained soils, not suited for hot, dry sites. Popular Christmas tree choice.
- Pine White Pinus strobus (2-2) Height 50-80', fast growth rate, prefers acidic, moist, well drained soils but tolerates saturated to dry soil conditions, easy to transplant and is an ideal species for windbreaks.
- **Spruce, Colorado Blue** *Picea pungens* (3-0 & 2-2) Height 100'. Grows in a wide range of soils including acidic, alkaline, drought tolerant, loamy, moist, rich, sandy, well drained, wet, and clay soils. The needles surround the branch at nearly right angles and are usually silvery to blue-green, but occasionally the blue is absent.
- Spruce, Norway Picea abies (2-2) Height 40-60', medium to fast growth rate, prefers acidic, drought tolerant, loamy, moist, sandy, well drained, clay soils.
- **Spruce, White** *Picea glauca* (2-1/2-2) Height 40-60', medium growth rate. Grows in a wide range of soils including acidic, drought tolerant, loamy, moist sandy, well drained, and clay soils. When crushed a pungent odor is apparent. Needle tips are pointed, but not sharp.

### **DECIDUOUS TREES:**

### Seedlings sizes range from 18"- 24"

- **Birch, Paper** *Betula papyrifera* Sometimes called Canoe Birch. Grows up to 50' in height. Tolerates moister soils & wet locations. Bark turns white in 4-6 years. Best when planted in groupings of 3-4.
- Hazelnut, American Corylus americana Grows to 15-18' tin height and spreads 10-12' at maturity. In 2-3 years it will bear small nuts which are an excellent food source for wildlife.
- Maple, Red Acer rubrum Grows 40-60' in height, medium to fast growth rate. Grows in acidic, loamy, moist, rich, sandy, silty loam, well-drained, wet, clay soils. In the fall its leaf color will change from green to flaming orange.
- Maple, Sugar, Acer saccharum Grows to 60-70' in height, slow to medium growth rate. Prefers well-drained soils. Brilliant fall leaf colors and pleasing growth habit.
- Oak, Red- (Quercus rubra) Grows at a fast rate and can reach 60–75' tall. Yields acorns that are round and ¾–1" long with a flat, thick, saucer-like cap
- Oak, Swamp White Quercus bicolor Grows 60-80' in height, rapid growth rate. Grows well in most soil types. Produces acorns which provide a food source for diverse wildlife.
- **Redbud, Eastern** *Ceris canadensis* Grows 20–30' in height, medium growth rate. Prefers acidic, alkaline, loamy, moist, rich, sandy, well-drained and clay soils. Rosy pink flowers bloom in Spring. Produces reddish –brown seed pods attractive and edible to birds.
- **Sycamore** *Platans occidentalis* Grows up to 100-140' in height, very fast growing and long lived with a massive trunk and white mottled bark. Prefers moist soils, best on creek bottoms or low slopes.
- **Tulip Tree** *Liriodendron tulipifera* Grows 80-100' in height, medium to fast growth rate with fairly narrow oval crown. Tulip shaped flowers and seeds provide nectar and food source for wildlife. Highly resistant to disease and insects.

### **DECIDUOUS SHRUBS:**

## Shrub seedling sizes range from 10"-24"

- American Highbush Cranberry Viburnum trilobum Grows 6-15' in height and 8-10' wide. Moderate growth rate of up to 3 ft. per year. Grows in moist areas, but can also thrive in dryer, sunny areas. Hardy, low maintenance shrub that will take care of itself once it is established.
- Black Chokeberry Aronia melanocarpa- Dark green glossy, finely-toothed 1 to 3-inch leaves, 2- to 3-inch clusters of white flowers in spring have showy pink anthers, Clusters of ¼ to ½ inch fruit turn purplish-black or black in late summer and autumn)
- Buttonbush Cephalanthus occidentalis, grows 6-12" in height, tolerates wet soils sun or shade
- Elderberry Sambucus canadensis Grows 5-12' in height. Hardy shrub, tolerates most soils. Produces white flowers in spring and fruit in late summer.
- Lilac Syringa vulgarus Grows 8-12' in height / wide. Fragrant flowers in mid-May.
- Nannyberry Viburnum trilobum— A tough, native large shrub with creamy white spring flower clusters, showy blue-black berries, and rich red-burgundy fall color. Height 12-20'
- **Ninebark** *Physocarpus Opulifolius* 5-9' spreading shrub. May-June is has white flowers and in mid-Septemer is has a red fruit. It has a beautiful exfoliating bark. Ninebark tolerates full sun and dry conditions.
- **Red Osier Dogwood** *Cornus stolinifera* Grows 7-9' in height, upright shrub. Great for wet or swampy conditions and along streams for erosion control. Distinct red stems (year round) and white drupe fruit in mid-August.
- **Serviceberry** *Amelanchier laevis* Grows 15-25' in height. Features showy, 5-petaled, slightly fragrant, white flowers in drooping clusters which appear in early spring before the leaves. Flowers give way to small, round, edible berries which ripen to dark purplish-black in June.
- White Flowering Dogwood Cornus Florida- Dark green foliage, delicate white flower clusters return year after year

## **CONSERVATION PACKS:**

Packs contain 2 of each species

Please refer to species descriptions in other sections of this form. Species descriptions not covered elsewhere are underlined.

- Bird & Butterfly Pack Black Chokeberry, Elderberry, <u>Liatris Spicata</u> (AKA Marsh Blazing Star, erect, slender perennial reaching a height of 2-6'),
   Ninebark, <u>Apricot Beauty Daylily</u> (3-4' tall perennial. Mid-season bloom. With a double-flower that is two-toned organe with lightly ruffled petals. Works great for cut flowers and can also be used in a container.)
- Native NY Wildlife Pack Red Osier Dogwood, <u>Black Cherry (Prunus serotnia</u> Grows up to 50' in height. Will have profuse white flowers in the spring and brilliant gold leaf color in the Fall. Grows best in rich, moist, well-drained soil with full sun), **Hazelnut, White Pine, Serviceberry**.
- Pollinator Pack- Ninebark, American Cranberry, Lilac, Redbud, White Flowering Dogwood
- Lavendar Variety Pac- <u>Fred Boutin</u> (silvery foliage, tall lavender blue flower spikes), <u>Provence</u> (tall, elegant flower spikes), <u>Munstead</u> (silvery green foliage, purple flower spikes), <u>Hidcote</u> (deep purple flower spikes)
- Hosta Variety Pack- Ventricosa, Hyacinthina, Albo Marginata, F.Aureo Marginata, Hadspen Grows 22" high, blue-green leaf color, lavender flower appears in July. Tolerates sun or shade, grows best in well-drained soils. Extensive root system, excellent for erosion control.
- Perennial Flower Pac- <u>Dream Baby Daylily</u> (Apricot with Reddish-purple ring), <u>Francis Fay Daylily</u> (Coral/Apricot), <u>Pink Damask Daylily</u> (ruffled soft pink blooms), <u>Stella De Oro Daylily</u> (golden yellow flowers), <u>Snow Queen Iris</u> (ruffled white bloom with a hint of cool blue or icy lavender tones)

## **FRUIT PACKS:**

- Blueberry: 2 varieties sold to allow for cross-pollination which helps the plants to be more productive.
  - **Blue Ray** is an upright hardy and drought resistant bush, which produces large firm aromatic berries. **Jersey** is a vigorous upright bush with a medium sized firm sweet berries.
- Red Raspberry, Latham Consistently produces deep-red, medium-sized berries, yields late June / early July, with an attractive and flavorful berry excellent for fresh eating, canning, freezing, and desserts. Sturdy upright canes will not need trellising to support the abundant fruit production. 10 pack.
- **Strawberry, Honeoye** Variety bred by Cornell Research Station in Geneva, NY. Combines winter hardiness, high productivity, attractive appearance and color with firm, large sized berries. 10 pack.
- Edible Fruit Variety Blackberry (large black firm, fleshy, and sweet fruit) (2), Blueberry—BlueRay (2) & Jersey (2), Raspberry (2) & Strawberry (2). 10 pack.
